The sun and moon appear simultaneously in the sky, symbolising the eclipse that coincided
with Christ's death. Saint Jerome and Mary Magdalene appear at the foot of the Cross and
gaze up at Christ's body with reverence and The Virgin, robed in purplish black
to denote, stands to the left of the Cross and John the Evangelist to the right.
They both look at the viewer and wring their hands in grief.
The Supper at Emmaus by
Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio
On the third day after the Crucifixion two of Jesus's disciples were walking to Emmaus when
they met the Christ. They failed to him, but that evening at supper
he ' took bread, and blessed it, and brake and gave to them. And their eyes were opened,
and they knew him; and he vanished out of their sight' (Luke 24: 30–31)
