

<p><b>Design Technology</b></p> <p>As part of your usual set of homework activities, you have been researching different food groups and what we need different kinds of food for (e.g. we need carbohydrates for energy). Can you use this information to help you to plan a healthy lunch box? Try to include foods from all of the different groups. You could draw and label your design. Next, can you design and make a 3D version of your lunch box. You could make it out of Play Dough or junk materials, use fabric, paint, glue..... Whatever you can find! Can you write an evaluation? What was easy to make? What challenges did you face?
