Dear parents,

The children are very excited to be back in school and so far they are enjoying our Explorers topic. Making number bonds to 20, building on our knowledge of number bonds to 10. If $1+9=10$. I change one of the numbers in the number sentence into a teen number, and will create a number bond of 20. Such as $11+9=20$ or $1+19=20$
