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### Geography

We are learning the terms 'rural' and 'urban', and the terms 'physical' and 'human'.

- Rural areas are the countryside,
- Urban areas are towns and cities,
- Physical features are things that naturally occur in the landscape, such as rivers, trees and mountains,
- Human features are things that people have added to the landscape, such as houses, roads and cars.

Look at the Rural and Urban photographs. Can you say which pictures would be found in rural places and which would be found in urban places? Maybe some of them could be found in both?

Next, look at the Aerial Photographs Powerpoint. What Physical and Human features can you see in the pictures?

You may just choose to discuss it with a grown-up, or you might choose to write or draw about it in your Remote Learning Book.

### History

Read the Roald Dahl Facts. Can you do your own piece of writing that includes these facts, organised as a fact file?

Remember that Fact Files should include:

- A title,
- Subheadings,
- Pictures (maybe with labels or captions),
- Facts and information,
- A 'Did you know' bubble.
