The Anglo-Saxons loved eating and drinking. They ate what they grew. Find out what foods the Anglo-Saxons would have used and design a menu for a whole day.



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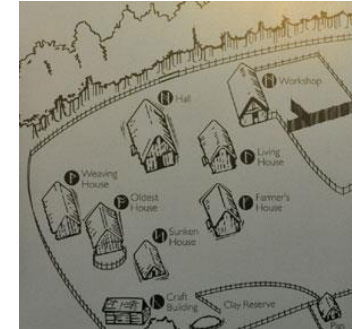


Anglo-Saxons made their clothes out of natural materials. Find out what type of garments men, women and children would have worn and what materials they would have used. Then design an outfit for each.

The Anglo – Saxons



Use this idea of an Anglo Saxon village to draw your own. Label the buildings eg Great Hall and the different areas eg pig pen. Make it colourful too(See attachment)



Many of the places where we live in Great Britain were named by The Anglo-Saxons. Eg towns like Stanstead where the ending **stead** means a place and Birmingham -**Ham**: meant a village, although it has grown since then! Try finding your own using the Saxon Place names attachment.





Can you find materials at home, like empty cereal boxes, to create your own Anglo-Saxon helmet?

Look at examples of Anglo-Saxon illuminated letters. Design your own illuminated letter (maybe for one of your initials). Use colouring pens/pencils/paint to make it as colourful as possible.
