We are looking at using different materials to make different types of lines: size and shape.


Using pencils, colouring pencils, crayons and felt pens have a go on some scrap paper at drawing different thicknesses of lines.

Can you draw thick lines and thin lines?

Look at examples of different shapes that can be made: horizontal and vertical lines, diagonal lines, zig zag lines and curly and wavy lines.

ACTIVITY: (This can be completed on the activity sheet or on any piece of plain paper.)

Take your pencil for a walk around the paper (see example). Children may need some help with this as they can make the boxes too small.



Colour in the different parts of the picture using the different shapes of lines. You could use felt pens, gel pens, crayons, pencils, coloured pencils...
