

Daily Handwriting Practice

This week our handwriting is the ic join.

It is tricky to show you the correct join on the computer. Before you start, have a look in the 'Handwriting book' and find our join. Look at where it sits on the line, what size the letters are and how they are joined together.

Monday

Write out two lines of the join. Remember to leave a finger space in between each join.

For example: ic ic ic ic ic ic ic ic ic ic ic ic ic

Tuesday

Write out the join 5 times and make a list of 10 words with the join in them.

For example: ic ic ic ic ic

ice, mice, trickle, twice, bicycle

Wednesday

Choose three of your words from yesterday. Write three sentences that include each of your words in them (one sentence for each word).

For example: Mrs Grant rode her bicycle to school, delighted that all the schools were open again!

Thursday

Invent 5 new words, these words must all have our handwriting join in them.

For example: friccley, miclevous, icezzy, gluic, hiccupez

Friday

Write a definition for each of your made up words.

For example: miclevous - a small furry animal that lives underground and eats shoes.
