

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| <p><u>Literacy</u></p> <p>Apostrophes for possession.</p> <p>To show that something belongs to someone, you add an apostrophe and an 's'.</p> <p>Instead of saying the bedroom of Sam, the apostrophe and the 's' make it Sam's bedroom. Much easier!</p> <p>Write 10 sentences that use a possessive apostrophe. Eg.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Jenny picked up Jo's pencil and handed it back to her. | <p><u>Literacy - Spring into Reading!</u></p> <p>We challenge you to read 4 different genres this term. | <p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>Race to 500!</p> <p>Play this game to practise your rounding skills. Play a few rounds against someone at home.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Pick a starting number: Start numbers: 258, 310, 648, 686, 295, 382, 373, 701, 696, 718, 284, 7282. Then, take it in turns to roll the dice and change your number: <i>Roll a 1: plus or minus 1 from your number</i> <i>Roll a 2: plus or minus 10 from your number</i> <i>Roll a 3: plus or minus 100 from your number</i> <i>Roll a 4: round your number to the nearest 10</i> <i>Roll a 5: round your number to the nearest 100</i> <i>Roll a 6: free choice from the options above</i> <p>The first player to reach 500 wins!</p> | <p><u>Times Tables</u></p> <p>Practising your times tables for 5 minutes every day is more effective than 25 minutes once a week!</p> <p>This term, focus on your 6,7 & 9 times tables.</p> <p>Do a Multiplication Tables quiz once a week and use the other days to practise any you get wrong!</p> <p>Here is a great website to quiz yourself: https://www.timestables.co.uk/multiplication-tables-check/</p> <p>You can also use the Soundcheck game on TT Rock Stars.</p> |
