The Friends

The following item is feedback from The Governing Body on the trial outside with the new entrances:

Thank you to all parents and children for using the new entrance and exit systems at the start and end of the day. The Governing Body feel that while there are a few inconveniences, these are far out-weighed by the raised level of safety within the school grounds. The dangers associated with pedestrians entering via the car park and surrounding the drop off point no longer exist.

We realise that there remain some danger spots around the school. We note that the problems of crossing Beresford Road still exist due to the level of traffic along there and the numbers parking. For this reason, we will continue with the drop off point so as not to add to that level of traffic outside the school. We would urge people to make those few extra steps to the zebra crossing to ensure the safe crossing of St John's Road and to encourage children walking home alone to cross at the zebra crossing rather than at the roundabout.

We would urge drivers to drive slowly and safely and to park a little further away, again making safer and healthier choices, to ensure further safety for our children. Please refrain from parking too close to the roundabout, on grass verges or across drive ways, and try to leave space for children to cross safely – avoiding the humps would be really helpful. The emergency access needs to be kept clear at all times.

The Governing Body are of course awaiting news from the City Council about the request for a formal crossing point on Beresford Road. We will keep you informed of our progress with this.

We will continue with the current arrangement. If people have further comments to make, that the governors needs to consider, please use our comments box in the entrance lobby. Thank you.


