

<p>Design Technology</p> <p>Make a sock puppet! Use an old sock. You could sew or glue on eyes, nose and mouth. You could make it look like an animal or an imaginary creature. It could have wings or hair or dangly legs! Let your imagination run wild!</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Look at some pictures of houses from the 17th century. Look at the features (black wooden frame that is visible from the outside, jettying, etc). Can you sketch a 17th century house? Can you use stippling, scumbling, shading, smudging or crosshatching to shade your drawing?</p>	<p>I.C.T.</p> <p>We are learning about how to use the internet safely and would like you to use PurpleMash to explore this.</p> <p>Log into your PurpleMash and find Computing, then scroll down to find lots of Internet Safety activities.</p> <p>Explore the activities and have a go at creating a leaflet about how to stay safe on the Internet using the leaflet template on Purple Mash.</p>
<p>P.E.</p> <p>Search for Joe Wicks on You Tube. He is doing a daily P.E. lesson and there are other work out videos for children there too!</p>	<p>History</p> <p>Watch the 'Flying Through London' video on our website showing what London might have looked like around the time of The Great Fire.</p> <p>Have a go at making your own Tudor style house. You can either use the template we have provided or have a go at designing your own model.</p>	<p>Geography</p> <p>This term we would have been taking part in the Ely Eel Day celebrations and walking round the Eel trail. We would like you to go for a walk around the trail with a grown up. Use the leaflet we have put on the website to follow the trail.</p> <p>Once you have completed the trail can you design your own map of it? Design symbols to show what you can see and include these in a key.</p>
<p>Music</p> <p>Experiment with beat, how musical instruments bring different sounds to music and bring your own noise by exploring the link to BBC Bring The Noise on the website.</p>	<p>R.E.</p> <p>We are learning about Sikhism this term. We'd like you to try and find out about Sikhism by doing some research and using the resources saved on the website. Have a go at answering these questions:</p> <p>Who are Sikhs? Who are gurus? What are Sikhs 5 key beliefs? When and where did Khalsa form?</p> <p>You can record your research as writing, drawing, a poster or fact file - you decide!</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Learn about the human life cycle by watching the <i>human life cycle video</i>.</p> <p>Find some pictures of yourself from a baby, to a toddler and now a child and think about how you have changed over time. How has your body changed? How has your brain changed? Record your thoughts in your home school book. Think about what you will be like as a teenager, an adult and then as an elderly person. Write down how you think you will change as you grow.</p>
