## **Message from Chair of Governors – October 2018**

I do hope you all had a really good summer and half term break.

We have now had our first Full Governors' meeting this year. This meeting sets up the Governing Body again for the forthcoming year, renewing our paperwork and receiving a range of training which always includes safeguarding. It also re-elects its Chair and Vice Chair and identifies members of the two Committees, Standards and Resources. I am delighted to have been elected for another year as Chair of Governors and to have Matthew Leach as Deputy Chair. It is a real honour to be able to work with the staff, pupils and parents for another year. We also welcomed John Henson, our new Deputy Head as a co-opted member of the Governing Body. Matthew Leach and Caroline Marshall remain as the Chair of the Resources and Standards Committees respectively.

We discussed in detail the results from the previous year and noted the positive information that we received whilst considering the implications for the Single Plan for the next year. We learnt that mental health will have a higher focus and a new policy is being written. A programme of training for monitoring will be available for governors on this. Governors are also required to complete the online Prevent training by half term.

It is good to hear that the new catering service appears to be really successful. Governors were hopeful that the new contract for this and cleaning would result in a more effective service. We were delighted to learn that we had achieved the 'Gold Award' for sport yet again.

We learnt about the new approach to rewards and are keen to have feedback on this at a later meeting. Our Learning Walks programme this term will focus on maths, writing and inclusion and these will be undertaken by the relevant specialist governor. Safeguarding and GDPR audits will be ongoing throughout the year.

We have been really pleased to have new Governors with us, but we now have a further three vacancies, two for this term and one for the Spring. The latter is for a Parent Governor and we would be delighted if you would consider putting yourself forward in the elections for this which will be held after half term. We are also actively recruiting for the other two co-opted governors. The team works well together with all Governors taking responsibility for at least one strategic area of the school. It's a rewarding, fulfilling and enjoyable role. Do consider joining us.
