# Curriculum Tasks

Please aim to do a curriculum task each day. Some tasks may take more than one day to complete.

### French

Create a 'sports' picture with as many different types of sports on as you can think of. You might draw your pictures or cut out images from magazines or maybe you have a different idea. Label all the sports in French.

Write a simple sentence about three of the sports expressing your likes or dislikes.

For example: J'aime le foot. (I like football).

If you can't remember the French word you will need to research it.

### Art

Create a dramatic and colourful volcano picture. You can do this in any way that you want. You could create a collage or use paints, felt tips, natural materials, crayons or anything else that you might have at home.

### Science

Research how to look after your teeth.

Create a poster advising people how to best look after their teeth.

Include lots of top tips!

#### Music

In Year 3 you learnt to play the recorder. If you have a recorder at home we would like you to practise playing it. Remind yourself of the skills you learnt last year. Your goal by the end of your time at home is to have learnt to play a new tune. You could find a new tune in a book, on the internet or you could compose your own.

## **PSHE**

Imagine that the school has decided to adopt a cat. Design a poster to display around school detailing how children should behave around the cat.

You might want to include information about children not feeding the cat, being calm around it, only stroking it gently. What should children do if the cat comes into their classroom?

# Geography

Research animals that live on mountains. There is a fantastic episode of Planet Earth on BBC iPlayer that focuses on animals that live in mountainous environments. Choose an animal from the documentary and explain which mountain region it lives in and how it has adapted to survive. You might want to think about its fur, feet/claws and diet. You could also draw the animal and label its features.
