1. Feedback from Anti Bullying Week

We asked ourselves the following questions:

What went well?

- Kindness tree activity was successful and display in entrance hall (thanks to Eloise and her friends) effective.
- The message of CHOOSE RESPECT came across.
- Behaviour in school and on the playground was better in that week.
- Free flow was LOVED by everyone!

What could we do better next time?

- Regular, weekly free flow playtimes would help build positive relationships across KS 1 and 2.
- ALL reps need to be organised and more productive so that all planned activities will actually take place.
- Wake Up Shake Up needs to be in a location where more children can see what happens and where no other activities take place at the same time. It also needs to be equipped with better working technology!

What we need to do next?

Find ways for the message of CHOOSE RESPECT to continue beyond the week, for example reviewing use of EJ and Bamboo, turn pandas into motivational bears with messages of kindness and respect, more PSHE activities in class, another behaviour survey to review new school behaviour policy, makeover of buddy bench.

2. PLASTIC & RECYCLING project

Two School Council reps brought up the issue of plastic waste and recycling over the last few months. So we agreed to make this important matter the next focus of our time, energy and funding. We brainstormed ideas to raise awareness in school, leading to better recycling:

- ⇒ Encouraging children and parents to take plastic waste from packed lunches home for recycling
- ⇒ Informing children and parents about the problem of waste and the need for better recycling
- ⇒ Improving ESJ's recycling by better labelling of bins and providing recycling bins for fruit waste and milk packages in every classroom
