<p>Chalk the numbers 1, 2 and 3 onto a wall or write them on paper and stick them up. Kick a ball twice, see which numbers you hit and add up your total score. You could challenge yourself by adding more numbers or kicking the ball 3 times. Have more than one go and see what your highest score is.</p> <p>Extra challenge: Record your problem solving as a number sentence using the + and = symbols.</p>	<p>Look at the 'Football is for Everyone' PowerPoint on the school website. Talk with someone at home about what you can see and what might be happening. Write a sentence about your favourite photo.</p> <p>Extra challenge: Turn your sentence into a short story.</p>
<p>Practise your football skills. Look at the cards on the school website or watch the Footy Pups videos and then have a go yourself. Which skill is easiest? Which is hardest? How many keepy uppies can you do?</p> <p>Extra challenge: Teach someone in your family one of the skills that you have practiced. Remember to give them clear instructions.</p>	<p>Complete the Euro Football Activity booklet on the school website. Let us know if you would like a printed copy put through your letterbox.</p>
