Day	Activity	
Monday	 Watch and join in with the 'Daily Phonics' video on the school website. Write the <i>igh</i> trigraph and <i>oa</i> digraph in your book (see example below). Ask a grown-up or older sibling to read the following words: <i>high, coat, loaf, light, road, tonight.</i> Segment the words and write them in your book under the correct digraph or trigraph. Choose one of the words and write a sentence with that word in <i>e.g. There is a coat on the road.</i> Watch and join in with the 'Daily Phonics' video on the school website. Today we are looking at the digraph: <i>oo.</i> The 'oo' digraph makes two sounds – a long sound like in the word 'food' and a short sound like in the word 'book'. Look at the pictures below and write down a word to match each picture. Which words have the long 'oo' sound and which words have the short 'oo' sound? Choose one of the words <i>are red.</i>

Wednesday	Watch and join in with the 'Daily Phonics' video on the school website. Write the <i>ar</i> and <i>or</i> digraph in your book (see Monday's example below). Ask a grown-up or older sibling to read the following words: <i>bar, for, card, cord, born, farmyard.</i> Segment the words and write them in your book under the correct digraph. Choose one of the words and write a sentence with that word in <i>e.g. The cow was born in the farmyard.</i>	
Thursday	Watch and join in with the 'Daily Phonics' video on the school website. Today we are looking at the digraphs: <i>ur</i> and <i>ow.</i> Look at the pictures below and write down a word to match each picture. Choose one of the words and write a sentence with that word in e.g. <i>I can hear a cow and an owl.</i>	
Friday	Watch and join in with the 'Daily Phonics' video on the school website. Read all of your green tricky words. Spell them out loud using the letter names. In your book, try and write them down without looking at them.	


Remember: When writing a sentence, have you got your capital letter, finger spaces and full stop?














Extra Challenge: Can you read these sentences?
