## Plants – observing plants

**Aim:** To observe closely using simple equipment by recording observations of a variety of plants in the local environment. To look closely at plants and trees and record what I see.

We hope the year 2s enjoy getting out in the fresh air for part of session.

Key/New Words: Roots, stem, leaves, flower, trunk, branches, observation, diagram.

**Plants:** Using the **Lesson Presentation**, show your child pictures of common wild and garden plants and trees. Can they identify any of the plants before you reveal the names?

Parts of a Flowering Plant: Use Parts of a Flowering Plant Activity Sheet which should be cut into pieces. Work together with your child to reassemble the picture of the plant (and if possible, to label the parts). Use the **Lesson Presentation** to check answers and address any misconceptions.

**Parts of a Tree**: Repeat the previous activity using the **Parts of a Tree Activity Sheet**. However, this time, get your child to do this independently. Give your child a time challenge, e.g. one minute.

**Observing Plants**: Get to a suitable outdoor location and encourage your child to closely study flowering plants and trees (if you have a magnifying glass — even better!). Children complete the **Observing Flowering Plants Activity Sheet** by drawing a labelled diagram of a plant and writing a description.

Optional challenge: Children to complete the differentiated **Observing Trees Activity Sheet** by drawing a labelled diagram of a tree and a detailed picture of a leaf from the tree.
Choose which sheet would suit your child best.
