Please choose from the following tasks. We would like children to aim to complete one each week. If children have homework that they would like us to see, please help them to remember to put their books in the homework tray on a Wednesday. Books will be given back to children by Friday each week.

A little every day:

Spellings - See the Year 4 page on the school website for weekly lists.

Reading - We encourage children to read, or be read to, for a minimum of 15 minutes a day.

Learn-Its - A set of multiplication facts to be memorised, please see the Year 4 page.

Times Tables - Please help your child to revise their times tables alongside their Learn-Its.

<p>SCIENCE</p> <p>Make a list of appliances in your home that use electricity. Make a second list and this time divide it up into appliances that are battery powered and appliances that are mains powered.</p> <p>You can write or draw the appliances on your lists.</p>	<p>HISTORY</p> <p>Create a poster or PowerPoint about a Roman topic that interests you. This could be Roman food, buildings, fashion, armies or something else.</p> <p>You might need to do some research about your chosen topic first.</p>
<p>MATHS</p> <p>Create a multiplication tables game. How you make your game is up to you. The aim of the game is to help the people playing it to improve their times tables knowledge.</p> <p>For example: times tables snap, pairs, a board game, a quiz</p>	<p>LITERACY</p> <p>Write 10 sentences that include each of these word types: Noun, Verb, Adjective, Adverb</p> <p>Colour-code them to show where you have used each type of word!</p> <p>Eg. Carefully, the small child placed the teacup back on the wooden table.</p>
<p>FRENCH</p> <p>Make a mindmap of all the French words you know. Remember to include the English translation. Try to include some colours, numbers and days of the week! Look up and add 5 new French words.</p>	<p>RE</p> <p>Draw a picture that represents what 'Harvest' means to you. Think about the types of food and colours you associate with Harvest time.</p>
