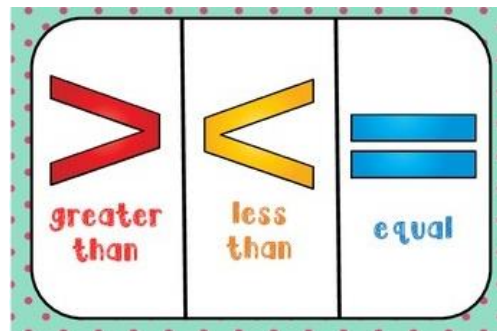

To compare the mass of different objects.

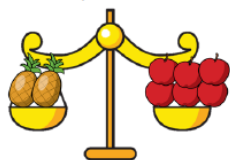
More weighing today! This time you need to remember the symbols you use to compare numbers. You are all great at using these, but here's a reminder!
