This week is your chance to learn as much as you can about The Great Fire of London. Make sure you complete the tasks below but if you feel like you want to go further and find out more about The Great Fire of London then please do so! The more you know, the better historian you will become!

You need to know these things by the end of the week:

- Key facts about the Great Fire.
- Who was Samuel Pepys and why is he important to the Great Fire?
- The order of what happened during the Great Fire.
- Understand that London looked very different at the time of the Great Fire.
