This week you are going to write a newspaper report. You will be writing about Tom and his journey to Africa so far. Use the success criteria above to help you. We have given you a template to use if you would like. Or you could use a double page spread in your book.

Monday: Read carefully through the Power point presentation...it's a long one but it gives you all the information you need to be able to write a good report. When you have read it through, come up with a catchy headline that you are going to use for your newspaper report. Challenge: Can you use alliteration?

Tuesday: Have a look through some of the examples of newspaper reports. Can you spot the features that you identified yesterday? Now write your introductory paragraph of your report. Remember you need to include what is happening, when it happened, where it happened, who is involved, and why it happened. We have given you an example.

Wednesday: Today, write the next paragraph of your report. Each new paragraph should have a new subheading explaining what that paragraph is going to be about. For example you may want to write a new paragraph to explain what Tom did in a new country.

Thursday: Continue with your report. Keep referring back to your success criteria to ensure you are getting all the information in that you need.

Friday: Your final day of writing your report. When it is done you could add a picture...don't forget to add a caption.
