Christmas

Due to COVID restrictions, some of our usual Christmas events will not be able to happen in quite the same way.



There will not be a Christmas dinner this year as we cannot manage to get so many children through in their bubbles safely. However to replace this we have decided that every class will have at some point in the last week, a Christmas Party afternoon. They will be able to make hats for this event instead of for the dinner; have some party games and we will be asking each child to bring a plate of party food in for themselves on the day so as to avoid sharing food.

The EYFS and KS1 usually do a Christmas performance at the end of term. We do not want the children to miss out on that chance to dress up; to be in a nativity; to mark the occasion in a way that you the parents can enjoy. Each class will therefore put on a short performance – a song or a poem in costume, that we can then share on the website with you all.

We also hope we can find a way for our musicians to mark the occasion and play a few Christmas tunes for us all to enjoy.

Unfortunately we have to ask you not to send Xmas cards into school this year – we will not be able to have our usual class Xmas card boxes or handing round of cards. Children will have to say Happy Christmas to friends instead and save cards for those loved ones they will not see and whom they can post cards to. There is also of course, the option of sending virtual cards. ⁽²⁾

We have paid for a virtual pantomime for all the children this year – the children will be able to watch it whenever it suits in the last couple of weeks leading up to Christmas. We thought this would go some way to compensating for not having Christmas performances to watch live this year. While it too is virtual, we hope the children will still get that same sense of excitement and enjoyment out of the world of pantomime.

Jolly Jumper Day

Children can choose to come wearing a colourful jumper on **Thursday 10th December** instead of their usual uniform sweatshirts – we are calling it *Jolly* Jumper Day to avoid parents feeling they have to buy a Christmas Jumper especially. If children have a Xmas jumper they can wear this or they can just wear a bright, colourful jumper instead. The staff always have a Xmas jumper day to raise money for charity – we are not asking children to contribute but thought they may enjoy wearing something different for a day too.

Hello,

It has been another term which is flying by, as we all deal with the continuing challenges of Covid-19 on everyday life. We have been delighted to have everyone back in school this term, and have supported school in their hard work to ensure suitable safety measures are in place to keep everyone safe, whilst trying to keep an exciting educational environment for the children.

This term, we have focused on the return to school and spent time understanding how last year's restrictions have impacted on children. We have been delighted to see how children have adapted to coming back to school and that some of the national trends for significant reductions in progress have not been seen at the school. This is a great reflection on the hard work put in by families through the restrictions. We have also focused on supporting the school in developing the Remote Learning provision for use when children or bubbles need to isolate, and in allocation of the government catch-up funding to provide additional targeted support for children.
