

## Literacy session 4 and 5

You are going to spend the next two sessions writing your own rhyming poem all about plants. Your poem needs to have:

- Rhyming pairs
- Adjectives
- A title

A good place to start is thinking of a title for your poem, then you can think of the rhyming pairs you'd like to put in your poem (remember you have a list of these in your book from session 1).

**Remember that the rhyming words need to be at the end of a sentence.** Once you've got that maybe you want to think about some adjectives that you'd like to use as well and jot them down. Your poem could be about different types of plants, how to look after plants, the life cycle of plants or maybe what plants need to grow. Try to present your poem with neat handwriting and add illustrations.

Here are some examples that you could look at for ideas.

### I'm a Little Seed

I'm a little seed,  
Brown and fat,  
I haven't got a front,  
And I haven't got a back.  
Plant me in the earth,  
Give me water each day,  
I'll grow to be an apple tree,  
While you play!





This is my garden,  
I'll plant it with care.  
Here are the seeds  
I'll plant in there.  
The sun will shine,  
The rain will fall.  
The seeds will sprout  
and grow up tall.

## Growing

Inside the seed  
All bundled up tight  
A tiny plant grows  
Needing water and light.  
  
I'll plant it in soil,  
Let it catch the sun's glow.  
Then water it gently  
And watch the plant grow!
