Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back! We hope that you had a nice holiday and are ready for the start of an exciting new term!

This term we will be doing SRE (Sex and Relationships Education) in PSHE. We have sent out a separate letter to explain what we are learning in more detail.

Literacy

We have started a history topic about The Great Fire of London and we have been doing this through our Literacy lessons. We have read lots of non-fiction books and we have gathered facts about the fire itself and Samuel Pepys. We also did a drama session where we interviewed Samuel Pepys and wrote our questions and his answers, making sure to use capital letters, question marks and full stops.

Numeracy

We have been learning about fractions. In Year 2, we learn about halves, quarters and thirds. We have looked at fractions of shapes and how to work out fractions of amounts (by sharing). We have also been looking at equivelant fractions.

Topic

We have looked again at continents and oceans in Geography and looking for signs of spring. We have continued to enjoy indoor and outdoor P.E. sessions.

Odd One Out






One half
