

What is CLIC?

CLIC is arithmetic practise. It is taught through repeating and revisiting the same things over and over so that a child can quickly recall their learning. It aims for children to become secure with what they have learnt which should mean that eventually they will be able to connect and apply their learning to other areas of maths quickly and with confidence.

Attached on the website is the three-week plan and PowerPoint for CLIC. You may notice during this week that your child is becoming more confident at recalling the content from last week. As they would in school at the end of each week, we'd like your child to complete at two assessments:

- 1) CLIC test
- 2) Learn It test

CLIC tests

Your child should know which level they are on (starting at CLIC 6) so please choose the appropriate one from the attachments on the remote learning page. If you are unsure which level your child should be on, please contact the year 2 team: y2@elystjohns.cambs.sch.uk

Ideally, they should be scoring 7/10+ Please help them if there are certain questions they are finding tricky. Do one test a week, starting on 'wk 1'.

Learn It tests

These are timed tests (90 seconds) whereby the children have to recall as many of their Learn It facts as quickly as possible. When the time is up, we ask the children use a different colour pen/pencil to answer any facts they didn't have time to during the 90 seconds. Currently, there is a level 7 and level 8 test. Most children are on Level 7. Do one test a week, starting on 'wk 1'.

Keeping track

If possible, keep a record of your child's progress using this grid. Typically, children move up CLIC and Learn It levels when they get 100% on three consecutive tests.
