We have really enjoyed seeing your close observational drawings and your Pop Art so we have combined them for this week's art!

We want you to use bright and bold colours as you did for the Pop Art tasks, but also improve your close observing drawing (observational drawing is drawing what you see).

**Your task**: Choose an everyday object (e.g. a shoe or a pair of glasses) and try to draw it as accurately as possible.

When we look at something that we intend to draw, we tend to look more carefully than usual. Choose your object. Look at it. We want you to truly see the shapes, the patterns, the perspective, the colours, the shadows and how all of the details interact.

Draw your object in pencil. Once you're happy with the level of detail, choose part of the object to colour. See the examples of how the artists have chosen parts of the object to make colourful.



The glasses have been drawn with lots of detail—notice the shading and shape. In this drawing, the background and inside the lenses adds a lot of other creative detail. The bold colours make a big
